

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JANUARY 1, 1939.

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of Canadian creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on January 1, 1939, amounted to 43,784,406 lb., consisting of 42,169,683 lb. actually reported and 1,614,723 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total, 30,331,062 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 13,453,344 lb., or 30.7 per cent in dairy factories.

The grand total stocks are 57.7 per cent more than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December 1938 was 9.5 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 10.3 million lb. for December 1937. This quantity represents withdrawals of 17.8 per cent of last month's revised stock figures.

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals reported by the railway companies, amounted to 845,600 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1939 amounted to 455,554 lb. w hich is an increase of 230.7 per cent over last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 30,481,981 lb. of cheese.

Adding 256,208 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 30,738,189 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 2.2 million 1b. or 7.6 per cent over last year and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.5 million 1b., which is 1 million 1b. greater than the same movement for December 1937 after adjusting for new firms. The current withdrawal is equivalent to 4.6 per cent of last month's revised stock figures.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 17,457,237 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 14,845,392 lb., which is an increase of 40.9 per cent over last year.

By-Products totalled 7,118,214 lb. Included in this amount are 5,292,291 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 346.3 per cent over last year. It will be noticed that this commodity has been sub-classified into Roller Process and Spray Process.

EGGS.

Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 897,302 dozens.

Fresh eggs are reported to a total of 344,690 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs are 31 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.6 million doz., as compared with a similar movement of 1.6 million doz. for December 1937.

Shell eggs in transit at January 1, 1939 amounted to 44,190 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 2,677,155 lb., being 22 per cent under the 1938 figure. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 815 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 586 thousand lb. during December 1937.

DRESSED POULTRY. Total stocks of all poultry at January 1, 1939 amounted to 12,265,462 lb., being 14.2 per cent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,760,598 lb., fowl to 1,438,487 lb., and turkeys to 4,331,893 lb.

The net "Into-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry is 5.4 million lb. as compared with 4.6 million lb. in December 1937.

Poultry in transit at January 1, 1939 amounted to 88,000 lb.
