



#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, OCTOBER 1, 1939

### CREAMERY BUTTER.

The Grand Total of creamory butter in Canada at the opening of business on October 1 was 57,418,639 lb. of which 56,813,839 lb. was in Storage and 604,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. All of the storage butter was of Canadian make, 41,550,099 lb. being held in cold storage warehouses, and 15,263,740 lb. or 26.9 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 1,344,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total stocks were 7.8 million 1b. or 12.1 per cent less than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of September was 2 million 1b. equivalent to 6.8 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month, as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 3.5 million 1b. for September 1938.

DAIRY BUTTER.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at October 1, 1939 amounted to 180,286 lb. which was a decrease of 285,499 lb. from last year.

CHEESE.

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 49,782,656 lb. of cheese. Adding 1,501,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 51,203,656 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 4.1 million 1b. or 8.6 per cent over last year and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.5 million 1b. as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 3.6 million 1b. for September 1938. The "Out-of-Storage" movement for September 1939 was equivalent to 2.9 per cent of last month's revised holdings.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS.

Whole Milk products amounted to 10,537,168 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 9,078,424 lb. which is a decrease of 12.9 million lb. from last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 746 thousand lb.

By-Products totalled 5,575,469 lb. Included in this amount are 4,370,745 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 2.5 million lb. from last year.

EGGS.

Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 7,478,642 dozens.

Fresh eggs were reported to a total of 568,268 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 3.2 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.1 million dozens, as compared with a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.3 million dozens for September 1938.


Shell eggs in transit at October 1, 1939 amounted to 44,190 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 5,368,124 lb. being 19.1 per cent greater than the 1938 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 644 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 323 thousand lb. during September 1938.

DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry as reported at October 1, 1939 were 3,275,895 lb. being 5.3 per cent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,004,951 lb. fowl to 950,317 lb. and turkeys to 584,176 lb.

The net "Into-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 370 thousand lb. as compared with 202 thousand lb. in September 1938.


