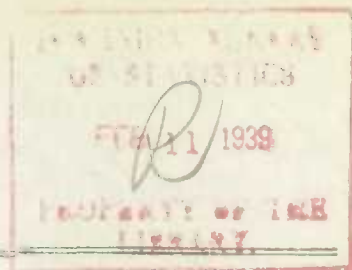

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, FEBRUARY 1, 1939.

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of Canadian creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on February 1, 1939, amounted to 34,110,911 lb. consisting of 33,824,701 lb. actually reported and 286,210 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total, 24,721,357 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 9,389,554 lb., or 27.5 per cent in dairy factories.

The grand total stocks are 85.3 per cent more than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of January was 9.6 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 9.4 million lb. for January 1938. This quantity represents withdrawals of 22 per cent of last month's revised stock figures.

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals reported by the railway companies, amounted to 481,600 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at February 1, 1939 amounted to 433,288 lb. which is an increase of 360,541 lb. over last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 28,997,512 lb. of cheese. Adding 138,575 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 29,136,087 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 2.6 million lb. or 9.7 per cent over last year and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.7 million lb., which is 300 thousand lb. less than the same movement for January, 1938. The current withdrawal is equivalent to 5.5 per cent of last month's revised stock figures.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 15,557,095 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 13,270,507 lb., which is an increase of 51 per cent over last year.

By-Products totalled 7,727,116 lb. Included in this amount are 5,678,272 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 380.7 per cent over last year. It will be noted that this commodity has been sub-classified into Roller Process and Spray Process.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 528,087 dozens.

Fresh eggs are reported to a total of 594,524 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs are 2.8 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 132<sup>thousand</sup>/dozen, as compared with a similar movement of 646 thousand doz. for January, 1938.

Shell eggs in transit at February 1, 1939 amounted to 29,460 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 2,668,442 lb., being 12.8 per cent under the 1938 figure. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 287 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 371 thousand lb. during January, 1938.

DRESSED POULTRY. Total stocks of all poultry at February 1, 1939 amounted to 10,927,017 lb., being 13 per cent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,155,102 lb., fowl to 1,055,921 lb., and turkeys to 4,084,870 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry is 1.5 million lb. as compared with 1.1 million lb. in January, 1938.

Poultry in transit at February 1, 1939 amounted to 72,000 lb.

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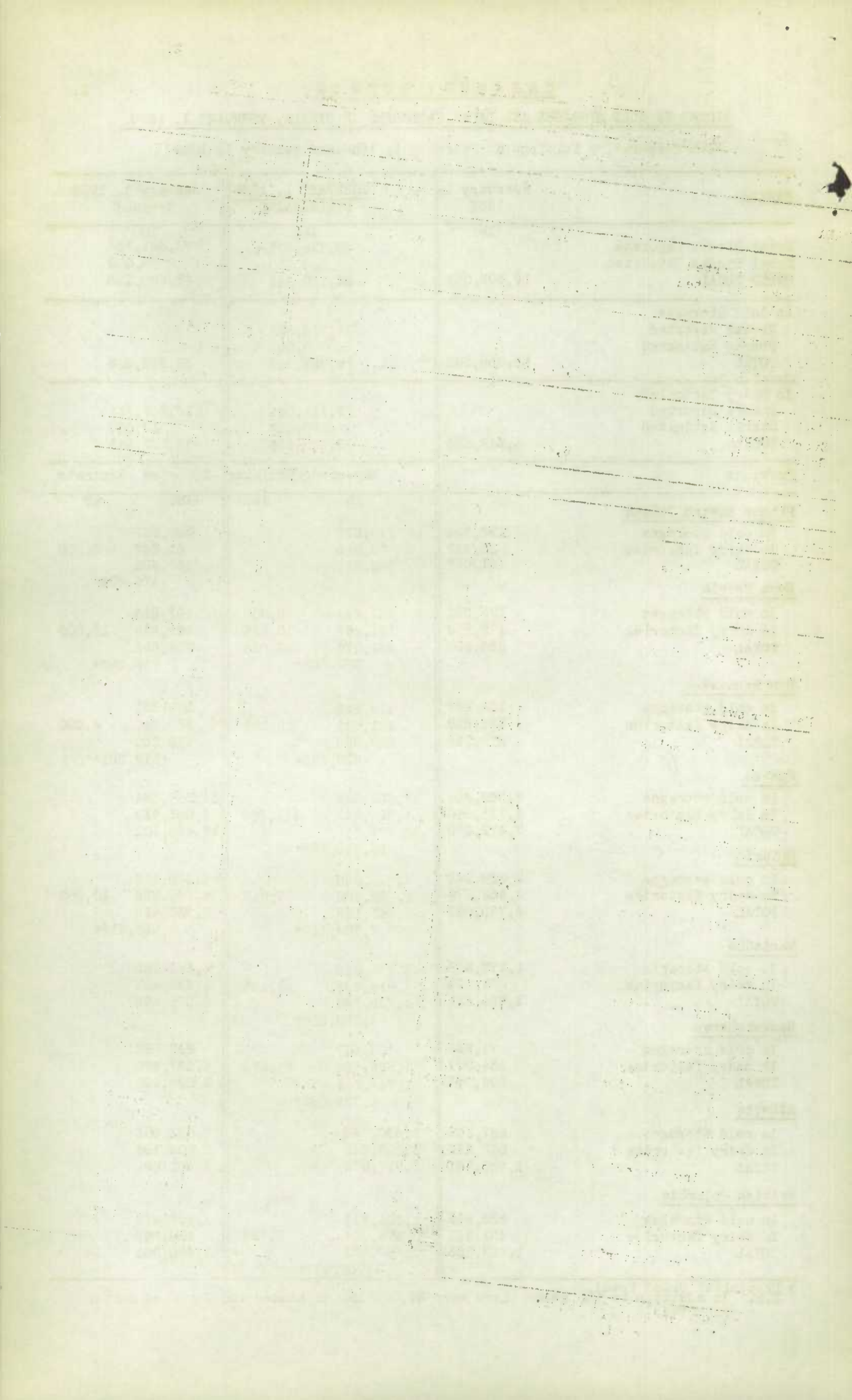
