STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MARCH 1, 1939.

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of Canadian creamery butter on hand in Canada at the opening of business on March 1, 1939, amounted to 22,838,934 lb. consisting of 22,541,203 lb. actually reported and 297,731 lb. estimated for firms that failed to report. Of the grand total, 16,750,900 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 6,088,034 lb., or 26.7 per cent in dairy factories.

The grand total stocks are 123.4 per cent more than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of February was 11.4 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 8.2 million lb. for February, 1938. Taking into consideration, however, imported butter the net "Out-of-Storage" movement for February, 1938 was 684,000 lbs. less than the above figure. Last month's "Out-of-Storage" movement represents withdrawals of 33.3 per cent of last month's revised stock figures.

Carloads of butter in transit by rail and at railway terminals reported by the railway companies, amounted to 369,600 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at March 1, 1939 amounted to 258,035 lb. which is an increase of 216,954 lb. over last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 26,761,738 lb. of cheese. Adding 99,681 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 26,861,419 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 2.7 million lb. or 11.1 per cent over last year and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.4 million lb., which is equal to the same movement for February, 1938. The net withdrawal is equivalent to 8.1 per cent of last month's revised stock figures.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 9,655,946 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 7,908,437 lb., which is an increase of 6.1 per cent over last year.

By-Products totalled 7,552,426 lb. Included in this amount are 5,359,617 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 4.3 million lb. over last year. It will be noted that this commodity has been sub-classified into Roller Process and Spray Process.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 263,426 dozens.

Fresh eggs are reported to a total of 326,086 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs are 4.6 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 539 thousand dozen, as compared with a similar movement of 592 thousand doz. for February, 1938.

Shell eggs in transit at March 1, 1939 amounted to 29,460 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 2,299,204 lb., being 14.2 per cent under the 1938 figure. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 354 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 379 thousand lb. during February, 1938.

DRESSED POULTRY. Total stocks of all poultry at March 1, 1939 amounted to 8,879,615 lb., being 11.4 percent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,278,695 lb., fowl to 723,555 lb., and turkeys to 3,407,271 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry is 2.1 million lb. as compared with 1.7 million lb. in February, 1938.

Poultry in transit at March 1, 1939 amounted to 289,000 lb.
