

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1939

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of creamery butter in Canada at the opening of business on May 1 was 9,863,837 lb., of which 9,667,837 lb. was in Storage and 196,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. All of the storage butter was of Canadian make, 5,702,062 lb. being held in cold storage warehouses, and 3,965,775 lb. or 41.0 per cent in dairy factories.

The Grand Total stocks are 4.7 million lb. or 93 per cent more than last year, the stocks of which, however, included 465 thousand lb. of bonded and imported butter. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of April was 2.8 million lb. as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.1 million lb. for April 1938, imported stocks included. Last month's "Out-of-Storage" movement represents withdrawals of 22.8 per cent of last month's revised stock figure.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1939 amounted to 104,358 lb. which is an increase of 94,400 lb. over last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 26,179,543 lb. of cheese.

Adding 184,431 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 26,363,974 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 8.6 million 1b. or 48.2 per cent over last year and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 350 thousand 1b. compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.6 million 1b. for April 1938.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 7,642,515 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 5,972,901 lb., which is a decrease of 41.1 per cent over last year.

By-Products totalled 6,168,585 lb. Included in this amount are 4,265,931 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 2.6 million lb. over last year.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 2,129,685 dozens.

Fresh eggs are reported to a total of 1,008,829 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs are 29.3 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 2,560,086 dozen, as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 3,267,866 doz. for April 1938.

Shell eggs in transit at May 1, 1939 amounted to 250,410 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 2,510,830 lb., being 11.6 per cent under the 1938 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 420,425 lb. as compared with a like movement of 598,983 lb. during April 1938.

DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry at May 1, 1939 amounted to 5,280,195

lb., being 6.6 per cent greater than at the same date last year.

Chickens in stock amounted to 2,236,140 lb., fowl to 232,021 lb., and turkeys to 2,468,239 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry is 1.5 million lb. as compared with 1.3 million lb. in April 1938.







STOCKS IN COLD STORAGES, KILLING PLANTS AND DAIRY FACTORIES IN CANADA.





STOCKS OF BUTTER, CHEESE AND EGGS IN THE PRINCIPAL CITIES OF CANADA


