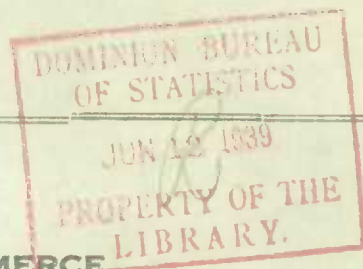

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JUNE 1, 1939

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of creamery butter in Canada at the opening of business on June 1 was 14,926,727 lb., of which 14,237,927 lb. was in Storage and 688,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. All of the storage butter was of Canadian make, 7,255,931 lb. being held in cold storage warehouses, and 6,981,996 lb. or 49 per cent in dairy factories.

The Grand Total stocks are 925 thousand lb. or 6.9 per cent more than last year, the stocks of which, however, included 272 thousand lb. of bonded and imported butter. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May was 4.6 million lb. as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 8.3 million lb. for May 1938, imported stocks included. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May is equivalent to 16.6% of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at June 1, 1939 amounted to 117,916 lb. which is an increase of 89,072 lb. over last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 25,390,648 lb. of cheese. Adding 839,700 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 26,230,348 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 3.4 million lb. or 14.8 per cent over last year and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 205 thousand lb. compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 5.1 million lb. for May 1938. The "Out-of-Storage" movement represents withdrawals of 0.8% of last month's revised stock figures.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 10,946,652 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 8,970,294 lb., which is a decrease of 36.3 per cent over last year. The "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 2.8 million.

By-Products totalled 5,276,959 lb. Included in this amount are 3,714,489 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 1.1 million lb. over last year.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 5,728,004 dozens.

Fresh eggs are reported to a total of 1,265,648 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs are 8.7 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 3,859,842 dozen, as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 3,216,980 doz. for May 1938.

Shell eggs in transit at June 1, 1939 amounted to 176,760 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 4,376,694 lb., being 24.9 per cent greater than the 1938 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 1,849,563 lb. as compared with a like movement of 664,089 lb. during May 1938.

Of the total frozen eggs reported, 67.8% were classified as frozen mixed, 19.9% as frozen whites, 9.1% as frozen yolks and 3.2% not stated.

DRESSED POULTRY. Total stocks of all poultry at June 1, 1939 amounted to 4,136,787 lb., being 4.6 per cent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,602,033 lb., fowl to 237,830 lb., and turkeys to 1,988,790 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry is 988 thousand lb. as compared with 998 thousand lb. in May 1938.
