

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JULY 1, 1939

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of creamery butter in Canada at the opening of business on July 1 was 32,341,227 lb. of which 31,277,227 lb. was in Storage and 1,064,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. All of the storage butter was of Canadian make, 19,883,600 lb. being held in cold storage warehouses, and 11,393,627 lb. or 36.4 per cent in dairy factories.

The Total storage stocks were 1.7 million lb. or 5.2 per cent less than last year, the stocks of which, however, included 177 thousand lb. of bonded and imported butter. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June 1939 was 17 million lb., equivalent to 41.6 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month, as compared with a similar movement of 19.7 million lb. for June, 1938, imported stocks included.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 1, 1989 amounted to 184,728 lb, which was a decrease of 15,223 lb. from last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 36,837,997 lb. of cheese.
Adding 1,195,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 38,032,997 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 5.5 million lb. or 16.8 per cent over last year and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 11.4 million lb. compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 9.7 million lb. for June 1938. The "Into-Storage" movement for June 1939 was equivalent to 51.7 per cent of the production for the same month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 9,951,568 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 7,866,063 lb., which is a decrease of 10.7 million lb. from last year. The net "Out-of-Storage Movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 1.2 million.

By-Products totalled 6,138,365 lb. Included in this amount are 4,536,595 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 767 thousand lb. over last year.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 7,303,356 dozens.

Fresh eggs are reported to a total of 1,016,494 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs are 6.4 per cont less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.2 million dozen, as compared with an equal movement for June 1938.

Shell eggs in transit at June 1, 1939 amounted to 176,760 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 5,913,273 lb., being 31.7 per cent greater than the 1938 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 1.5 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 986 thousand lb. during June 1938.


DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry at July 1, 1939 amounted to 3,555,182 lb.

being 0.9 per cent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens
in stock amounted to 1,060,188 lb., fowl to 454,273 lb., and turkeys to 1,586,006 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry is 584 thousand lb. as compared with 429 thousand lb. in June 1938.

Poultry in transit amounted to 22,000 lb.


