

#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, AUGUST 1, 1939

CREAMERY BUTTER. The Grand Total of creamery butter in Canada at the opening of business on August 1 was 46,596,639 lb., of which 45,644,639 lb. was in Storage and 952,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. All of the storage butter was of Canadian make, 31,985,389 lb. being held in cold storage warehouses, and 13,659,252 lb. or 30 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures however, there was included an estimate of 311,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total stocks were 4.7 million 1b. or 9.4 per cent less than last year, the stocks of which, however, included 161 thousand 1b. of bonded and imported butter. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of July was 14.1 million 1b., equivalent to 36.9 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 17.4 million 1b. for July 1938, imported stocks included.

DAIRY BUTTER. The stocks of this commodity as reported at August 1, 1939 amounted to 291,570 lb. which was a decrease of 64,706 lb. from last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 42,432,487 lb. of cheese.

Adding 4,860,000 lb. as the estimate for oustanding firms, a grand total of 47,292,487 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 8,3 million 1b, or 21,3 per cent over last year and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 9 million 1b, compared with a similar movement of 6,4 million 1b, for July 1938. The "Into-Storage" movement for July 1939 was equivalent to 40 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS. Whole Milk products amounted to 7,349,086 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 5,205,826 lb. which is a decrease of 16.1 million lb. from last year. The "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for July was 2.8 million

By-Products totalled 6,057,326 lb. Included in this amount are 4,260,910 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 700 thousand lb. from last year.

EGGS. Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 8,099,347 dozens.

Fresh eggs were reported to a total of 567,560 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 6.7 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 376,545 dozens, as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 399,786 doz. for July 1938.

Shell eggs in transit at August 1, 1939 amounted to 117,840 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 6,410,189 lb. being 28.5 per cent greater than the 1938 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 370,968 lb. as compared with a like movement of 499,748 lb. during July 1938.

DRESSED POULTRY. Total stocks of all poultry at August 1, 1939 amounted to 3,340,283 lb. being 3.5 per cent greater than at thesame date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 770,104 lb. fowl to 449,027 lb. and turkeys to 1,293,499 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 278 thousand lb. as compared with 296 thousand lb. in July 1938.

Poultry in transit amounted to 22,000 lb.






