

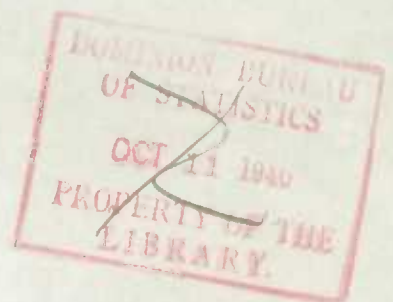

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, OCTOBER 1, 1940

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on October 1, 1940 was 59,354,695 lb. of which 58,637,895 lb. was Canadian make, In Storage and 716,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 42,786,325 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 15,851,570 lb., or 27 per cent., in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimates of 1,393,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 1.6 million lb., or 2.8 per cent., more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of September was 716 thousand lb., (being 2.7 per cent. of the preliminary figures of September 1940 production) as compared with a similar movement of 2.1 million lb. for September 1939.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at October 1, 1940 amounted to 548,288 lb. which was an increase of 314,218 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 31,170,691 lb. of cheese. Adding 1,780,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 32,950,691 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 19.4 million lb., or 37.1 per cent. from last year, and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 404 thousand lb. as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 948 thousand lb. for September 1939. The "Into-Storage" movement for September 1940 was equivalent to 2 per cent. of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Whole Milk products amounted to 29,880,718 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 27,334,035 lb., which is an increase of 20 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 2.1 million lb.

By-Products totalled 5,147,503 lb. Included in this amount are 4,117,961 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 396 thousand lb. from last year.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs amounted to a total of 7,424,589 dozens.

Fresh Eggs were reported to a total of 701,314 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 4.7 per cent. more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.1 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 726 thousand dozens for September 1939.

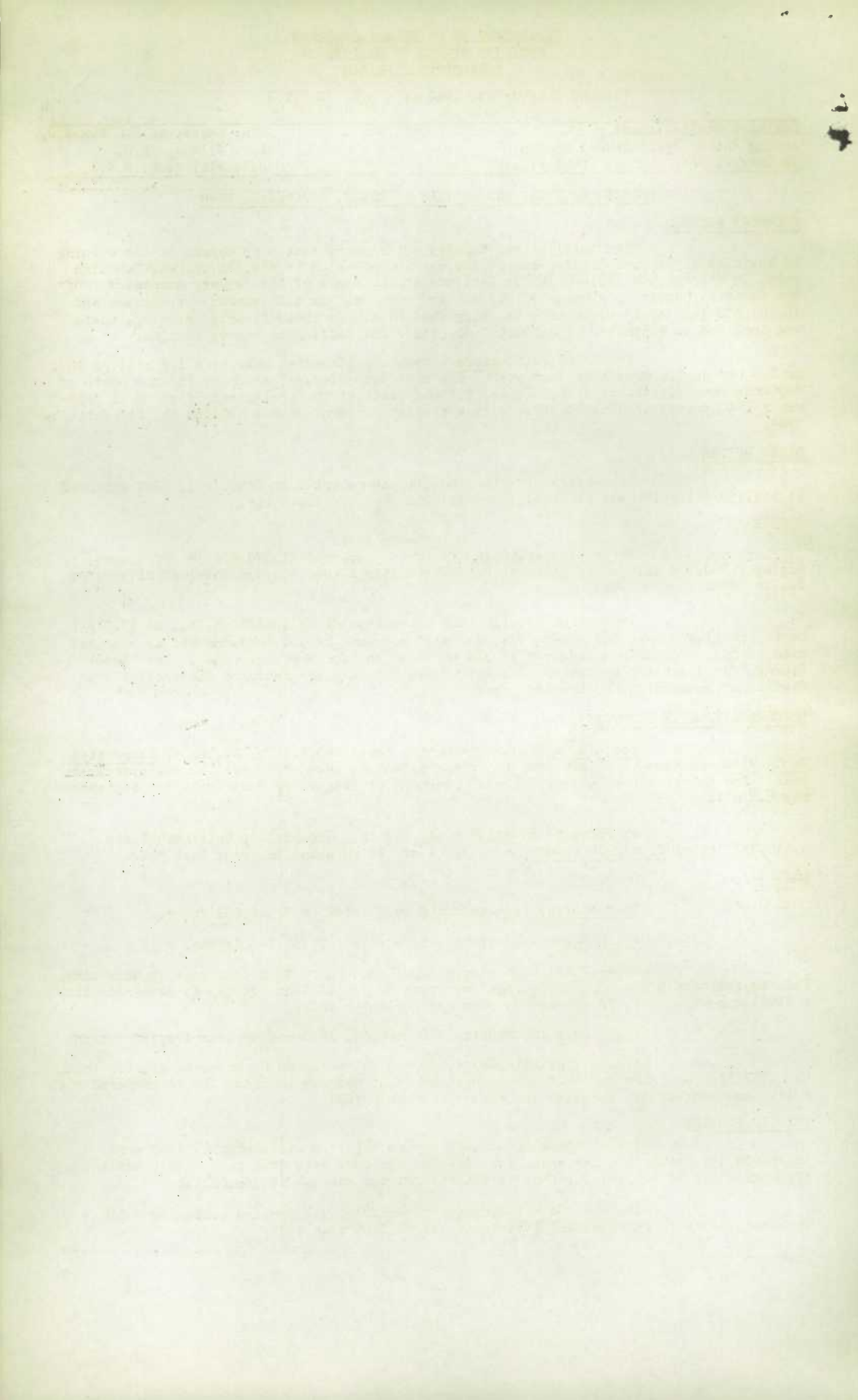
Shell eggs in transit at October 1, 1940 amounted to 176,760 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 6,590,239 lb. being 22.8 per cent. greater than the 1939 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 469 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 643 thousand lb. during September 1939.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry as reported at October 1, 1940 were 2,918,668 lb. being 11.4 per cent. less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 843,491 lb; fowl to 673,865 lb; and turkeys to 960,093 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 320 thousand lb. as compared with 207 thousand lb. in September 1939.
