STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, NOVEMBER 1, 1940

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on November 1, 1940 was 52,231,207 lb. of which 51,698,807 lb. was Canadian make In Storage and 554,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 37,356,178 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 14,342,629 lb., or 27.7 per cent., in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 1,503,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 4.7 million lb., or 8.3 per cent., less than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of October was 6.7 million lb., (being 11.5 per cent. of the revised total stocks for October 1, 1940) as compared with a similar movement of 620 thousand lb. for October 1939.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1940 amounted to 415,846 lb. which was an increase of 186,369 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 31,698,104 lb. of cheese. Adding 927,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 32,625,104 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 8.6 million lb., or 20.8 per cent. from last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 444 thousand lb. as compared with a similar movement of 11.1 million lb. for October 1939. The "Out-of-Storage" movement for October 1940 was equivalent to 1.3 per cent. of last month's revised holdings.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Whole Milk Products amounted to 28,474,713 lb.. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 26,030,331 lb., which is an increase of 18.5 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for October was 1.5 million lb.

By-Products totalled 5,383,846 lb. Included in this amount are 4,209,963 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, an increase of 397 thousand lb. over last year.

The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs amounted to a total of 3,635,393 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 382,423 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 18.7 per cent. less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 4.1 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 2.8 million dozens for October 1939. Included in these data are estimates for late firms.

Shell eggs in transit at November 1, 1940 amounted to 162,030 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 6,003,759 lb. being 24.3 per cent. greater than the 1939 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 607 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 540 thousand lb. during October 1939.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at November 1, 1940 were 2,896,826 lb. being 36.7 per cent. less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,161,113 lb; fowl to 966,528 lb; and turkeys to 231,350 lb; but these figures do not include the estimate included in total poultry

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 38 thousand lb. as compared with 1.3 million lb. in October 1939.


