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

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, APRIL 1, 1940.

CREAMERY BUTTER.

The Total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on April 1 was 14,042,671 lb. of which 13,622,671 lb. was Canadian make In Storage and 420,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 9,101,930 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 4,520,741 lb., or 33.2 per cent, in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 220,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 1.1 million 1b., or 8.6 per cent more than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of March was 8.9 million 1b. (being 39.5 per cent of the revised total stocks of March 1, 1940) as compared with a similar movement of 10.3 million 1b. for March 1939.

DAIRY BUTTER.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at April 1, 1940 amounted to 113,625 lb. which was a decrease of 44,241 lb. from last year.

CHEESE. Warehouses and dairy factories reported 12,954,761 lb. of cheese.
Adding 317,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 13,271,761 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 12.8 million 1b. or 49.2 per cent under last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.6 million 1b. as compared with a similar movement of 1.2 million 1b. for March 1939. The "Out-of-Storage" movement for March 1940 was equivalent to 10.8 per cent of last month's revised holdings.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Whole Milk products amounted to 10,628,944 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 9,541,813 lb., (including an estimate of 90 thousand lb. for firms failing to report (which is an increase of 3.7 million lb. from last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 859 thousand lb.

By-Products totalled 3,005,649 lb. Included in this amount are 2,553,534 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, (which also includes an estimate of 160 thousand lb.) a decrease of 1.9 million lb. from last year.

EGGS.

Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 665,703 dozens.

Fresh eggs were reported to a total of 910,424 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 172.2 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 95 thousand dozens, as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 21 thousand dozens for March 1939.

Shell eggs in transit at April 1, 1940 amounted to 88,380 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 3,003,690 lb. being 43.7 per cent more than the 1939 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 114 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 216 thousand lb. during March 1939.

DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry as reported at April 1, 1940 were 9,815,303 lb. being 47.1 per cent greater than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,108,141 lb., fowl to 1,641,736 lb. and turkeys to 3,410,306 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 2.4 million lb. as compared with 2.2 million lb. in March 1939.
