

## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JUNE 1, 1940.

#### CREAMERY BUTTER.

The Total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on June 1 was 15,559,766 lb. of which 14,714,166 lb. was Canadian make In Storage and 845,600 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 7,524,903 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 7,189,263 lb., or 48.9 per cent, in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 634,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 440 thousand lb., or 3.1 per cent, more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May was 4.4 million lb. (being 16.0 per cent of the preliminary figures of May 1940 production) as compared with a similar movement of 4.6 million lb. for May 1939.

## DAIRY BUTTER.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at June 1, 1940 amounted to 125,527 lb. which was an increase of 4,176 lb. from last year.

#### CH EESE.

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 20,554,238 lb. of cheese. Adding 965,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 21,519,238 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 5.6 million lb., or 20.7 per cent., from last year, and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 7.6 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 614 thousand lb. for May 1939. The "Into-Storage" movement for May 1940 was equivalent to 59.1 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month,

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Whole Milk products amounted to 12,855,237 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 11,352,161 lb., (including an estimate of 200 thousand lb. for lirms failing to report on time) which is an increase of 2.3 million lb. from last year The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 896 thousand lb.

By-Products totalled 2,945,247 lb. Included in this amount are 2,254,808 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 2.5 million lb. from last year.

#### EGGS.

Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 7,022,680 dozens. Fresh eggs were reported to a total of 1,667,470 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 22,1 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 4,1 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 4,0 million dozens for May 1939.


Shell eggs in transit at June 1, 1940 amounted to 338,790 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 5,490,556 lb. being 25.4 per cent greater than the The net "Into-Storage" movement was 1,7 million lb. as compared with 1939 figures. a like movement of 1.8 million lb. during May 1939.

DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry as reported at June 1, 1940 were 5,991,426 1b. being 44.8 per cent more than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,102,583 lb.; fowl to 730,244 lb., and turkeys to 2,699,754 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 1.9 million 1b. as compared with 990 thousand 1b. in May 1939.






