



### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JULY 1, 1940

### CREAMERY BUTTER.

The Total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on July 1 was 33,664,043 lb. of which 32,768,043 lb. was Canadian make In Storage and 896,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 20,114,412 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 12,653,631 lb., or 38.6 per cent., in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 1,302,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 970 thousand lb., or 3.1 per cent., more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June was 17.9 million lb. (being 43.9 per cent. of the preliminary figures of June 1940 production) as compared with a similar movement of 17.5 million lb. for June 1939.

#### DAIRY BUTTER.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 1, 1940 amounted to 283,542 lb. which was an increase of 98,714 lb. from last year.

#### CHEESE.

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 27,095,192 lb. of cheese.
Adding 1,361,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 28,456,192 lb., is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 10.3 million lb., or 26.5 per cent., from last year, and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 6.7 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 11.6 million lb. for June 1939. The "Into-Storage" movement for June 1940 was equivalent to 27.9 per cent. of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Whole Milk products amounted to 21,791,058 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 19,881,279 lb., (including an estimate of 800 thousand lb. for firms failing to report on time) which is an increase of 11,9 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 8.1 million

By-Products totalled 4,629,619 lb. Included in this amount are 3,475,991 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, (which also includes an estimate of 31,000 lb.) a decrease of 1.3 million lb. from last year.

#### EGGS.

Cold Storage eggs amounted to a total of 7,857,105 dozens.

Fresh eggs were reported to a total of 1,011,548 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 7.1 per cent. more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into~Storage" movement of 157 thousand dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 1.2 million dozens for June 1939.


Shell eggs in transit at July 1, 1940 amounted to 486,090 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 7,027,292 lb. being 16.4 per cent. greater than the 1939 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 1.5 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.7 million lb. during June 1939.

#### DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry as reported at July 1, 1940 were 4,800,869 lb. being 32.7 per cent. more than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,322,685 lb.; fowl to 727,704 lb.; and turkeys to 2,275,220 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 1.2 million lb. as compared with 521 thousand lb. in June, 1939.




