STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, AUGUST 1, 1940

CREAMERY BUTTER.

The Total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on August 1 was 50,676,491 lb. of which 50,060,491 lb. was Canadian make. In Storage and 616,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 34,820,140 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 15,232,351 lb., or 30.4 per cent., in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 1,647,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 4.2 million lb., or 9.2 per cent., more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of July was 17.5 million lb. (being 44.5 per cent. of the preliminary figures of July 1940 production) as compared with a similar movement of 14.0 million lb. for July 1939.

DAIRY BUTTER.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at August 1, 1940 amounted to 493,406 lb. which was an increase of 200,748 lb. from last year.

CHEESE.

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 30,363,638 lb. of cheese.

Adding 1,962,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 32,325,638 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 13.3 million lb., or 29.1 per cent., from last year, and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 3.9 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 6.9 million lb. for July 1939. The "Into-Storage" movement for July 1940 was equivalent to 15.0 per cent. of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS:

Whole Milk products amounted to 25,605,833 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 22,735,940 lb., which is an increase of 17.2 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for July was 3.2 million lb.

By-Products totalled 5,051,873 lb. Included in this amount are 4,010,987 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 1.5 million lb. from last year.

EGGS.

Cold Storage Eggs amounted to a total of 8,802,961 dozens.

Fresh Eggs were reported to a total of 962,733 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 12.5 per cent. more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 368 thousand dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 399 thousand dozens for July 1939.

Shell eggs in transit at August 1, 1940 amounted to 73,650 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 7,449,406 lb. being 16.2 per cent. greater than the 1939 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 422 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 372 thousand lb. during July 1939.

DRESSED POULTRY.

Total stocks of all poultry as reported at August 1, 1940 were 4,176,655 lb. being 28.5 per cent. more than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 991,058 lb.; fowl to 672,949 lb.; and turkeys to 1,970,979 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 646 thousand lb. as compared with 368 thousand lb. in July 1939.
