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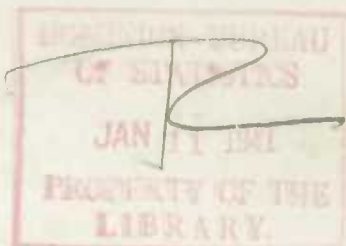

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JANUARY 1, 1941

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on January 1, 1941 was 33,394,182 lb. of which 33,058,182 lb. was Canadian make in storage and 336,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Of the Canadian butter in storage 22,688,304 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 10,369,878 lb., or 31.4 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 844,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 7.9 million lb. or 19.4 per cent, less than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December was 8.7 million lb. (being 20.8 per cent of the revised total stocks for December 1940) as compared with a similar movement of 8.5 million lb. for December 1939.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1941 amounted to 277,362 lb. which was an increase of 139,085 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 22,525,747 lb. of cheese. Adding 1,224,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 23,749,747 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 2.0 million lb. or 7.7 per cent from last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.7 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 2.5 million lb. for December 1939. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1940 was equivalent to 13.5 per cent of last month's revised holdings.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Whole Milk Products amounted to 13,317,467 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 11,765,125 lb. which is a decrease of 886 thousand lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for December was 7.5 million lb.

By-Products totalled 3,967,409 lb. Included in this amount are 3,025,544 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 324 thousand lb. from last year.

The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs amounted to a total of 96,706 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 631,554 dozens

Total Shell Eggs were 48.9 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 312 thousand dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 538 thousand dozens for December 1939.

Shell eggs in transit at January 1, 1941 amounted to 14,730 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 5,058,786 lb. being 35.1 per cent more than the 1940 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 45 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 563 thousand lb. during December 1939.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at January 1, 1941 were 12,251,919 lb. being 19.2 per cent less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stocks amounted to 5,704,367 lb; fowl to 1,754,059 lb; and turkeys to 4,060,841 lb.

The net "Into-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 5.5 million lb. as compared with 7.6 million lb. in December 1939.
