STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, OCTOBER 1, 1941

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamory Butter in Canada at the opening of business on October 1, 1941 was 69,345,559 lb. of which 69,139,959 lb. was Canadian make in Storage, and 705,600 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. In addition there were potential stocks of 572,600 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 48,971,445 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 20,168,514 lb. or 29.2 per cent. in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 2,379,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 10.7 million lb. or 18.4 per cent, more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of September was 7.2 million lb. (being 22.3 per cent of the preliminary figures for September production) as compared with a similar movement of 498 thousand lb. for September 1940.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at October 1, 1941 amounted to 235,041 lb. which was a decrease of 312,819 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 43,049,943 lb. of cheese. Adding 1,523,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 44,572,943 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 11.2 million lb. or 33.7 per cent over last year, and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 2.6 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 294 thousand lb. for September 1940. The net "Into-Storage" movement for September 1941 was 13.2 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 27,053,153 lb. which is a decrease of 459 thousand lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 1.6 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 2,652,826 lb., a decrease of 1.5 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 168 thousand lb. from last month. The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 7,110,787 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,157,614 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 1.5 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.9 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 1,1 million dozens for September 1940.

Shell eggs in transit at October 1, 1941 amounted to 603,930

dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 6,633,180 lb. being 0.3 per cent more than the 1940 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 21 thousand lb. as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 449 thousand lb. during September 1940.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at October 1, 1941 were 3,519,096 lb. being 19.8 per cent more than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,145,994 lb; fowl to 667,498 lb; and turkeys to 872,893 lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 678 thousand lb. as compared with a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 302 thousand lb. in September 1940.
