STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, FEBRUARY 1, 1941

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on February 1, 1941 was 27,566,149 lb. of which 27,055,709 lb. was Canadian make In Storage, 296,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies and 213,640 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 17,236,249 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 9,819,460 lb., or 36.3 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 388,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 5.7 million lb., or 17.4 per cent less than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of January was 6.2 million lb. (being 18.5 per cent of the revised total stocks for January 1941) as compared with a similar movement of 8.2 million lb. for January 1940.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at February 1, 1941 amounted to 190,051 lb. which was an increase of 45,034 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 20,681,339 lb. of cheese.

Adding 716,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 21,397,339 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 815 thousand 1b, or 4.0 per cent ever last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.3 million 1b, as compared with a like movement of 5.1 million 1b, for January 1940. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for January 1941 was equivalent to 13.3 per cent of last month's revised holdings.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Whole Milk Products amounted to 9,772,526 lb, Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 8,335,056 lo. which is a decrease of 766 thousand lb, from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for January was 3.4 million lb.

By-Products totalled 3,200,655 lb. Included in this amount are 2,377,028 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 633 thousand lb. from last year.

The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs amounted to a total of 223,077 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,313,221 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 18.8 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 793 thousand dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 467 thousand dozens for January 1940.


Shell eggs in transit at February 1, 1941 amounted to 147,300 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 3,872,760 lb. being 17.9 per cent more than the 1940 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 537 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 461 thousand lb. during January 1940.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at February 1, 1941 were 11,984,337 lb. being 12.7 per cent less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,914,910 lb; fowl to 1,299,073 lb; and turkeys to 3,838,554 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 320 thousand lb. as compared with 1.1 million lb. in January 1940.






