

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MARCH 1, 1941

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Surmary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on March 1, 1941 was 18,415,047 lb. of which 17,380,503 lb. was Canadian make In Storage, 772,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies, 51,520 lb. "Imported" and 210,224 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 10,703,979 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 6,676,524 lb., or 38,4 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 348,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 5.2 million lb., or 23.1 per cent, less than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of February was 9.7 million lb. (being 35.8 per cent of the revised total stocks for February 1941) as compared with a similar movement of 10.1 million lb. for February 1940.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at March 1, 1941 amounted to 147,221 lb. which was an increase of 2,180 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 17,537,248 lb. of choose.

Adding 633,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 18,170,248 lb.
is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 3.2 million lb., or 21.6 per cent over last year, and a not "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.3 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 5.6 million lb. for February 1940. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for February 1941 was equivalent to 15.2 per cent of last month's revised holdings.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Whole Milk Products amounted to 6,250,091 lb. Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 5,426,172 lb. which is a decrease of 3.2 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for February was 2.8 million lb,

By-Products totalled 2,420,403 lb. Included in this amount are 1,820,733 lb. of Skim Milk Powder, a decrease of 537 thousand lb. from last year.

The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs amounted to a total of 527,208 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,221,428 dozons.

Total Sholl Eggs were 19.2 per cont more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 230 thousand dozens, as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 408 thousand dozens for February 1940.


Shell oggs in transit at March 1, 1941 amounted to 88,380 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 3,775,515 lb. being 20.6 per cont more than the 1940 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 97 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 155 thousand lb. during February 1940.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at March 1, 1941 were 10,463,376 lb. being 14.2 per cent less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,550,462 lb; fowl to 1,181,989 lb; and turkeys to 3,892,361 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 1.3 million lb. as compared with 1.9 million lb. in February 1940.


