

#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JULY 1, 1941

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on July 1, 1941 was 37,361,642 lb. of which 36,003,642 lb. was Canadian make in storage, 1,288,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies and 70,000 lb. "Imported". In addition there were potential stocks of 168,168 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 23,165,492 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 12,838,160 lb. or 35.7 per cent. in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 1,066,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 3.4 million 1b. or 10.5 per cent more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June was 17.5 million 1b. (being 43.3 per cent of the preliminary figures for June production) as compared with a similar movement of 17.8 million 1b. for June 1940.

#### DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 1, 1941 amounted to 198,637 lb. which was a decrease of 85,921 lb. from last year.

#### CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 32,467,336 lb. of cheese. Adding 1,273,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 33,740,336 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 4.8 million lb. or 16.5 per cent over last year, and a net "Into-Storage" movement of 9.5 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 6.7 million lb. for June 1940. The net "Into-Storage" movement for June 1941 was equivalent to 37.3 per cent of the preliminary figures of production for the same month.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 9,179,109 lb. which is a decrease of 10.4 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 1.4 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 2,451,721 lb.. a decrease of 1.1 million lb. from last year and and increase of 545 thousand lb. over last month.

The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 9,480,888 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 876,990 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 16.4 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 2.7 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 159 thousand dozens for June 1940.

Shell eggs in transit at July 1, 1941 amounted to 206,220 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 6,587,436 lb. being 6.3 per cent less than the 1940 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 702 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.5 million lb. during June 1940.

DRESSED POULTRY Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at July 1, 1941 were 3,995,886 lb. being 17.1 per cent less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,064,501 lb; fowl to 350,684 lb; and turkeys to 2,101,950 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 1.0 million lb. as compared with 1.2 million lb. in June 1940.




