STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, AUGUST 1, 1941

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on August 1, 1941 was 52,200,593 lb. of which 50,848,793 lb. was Canadian make in Storage, 1,360,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. In addition there were potential stocks of 172,776 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 34,768,911 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 16,079,882 lb. or 31.6 per cent. in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 2,077,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 923 thousand lb. or 1.8 per cent more than last year. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of July was 15 million lb. being 38.2 per cent of the preliminary figures for July production) as compared with a similar movement of 17.3 million lb. for July 1940.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at August 1, 1941 amounted to 320,614 lb. which was a decrease of 175,237 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 30,503,349 lb. of cheese. Adding 1,967,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 32,470,349 lb. is shown.

These figures represent a decrease of 792 thousand lb. or 2.4 per cent from last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.5 million lb. as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 4.3 million lb. for July 1940. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for July 1941 was 4.3 per cent of last month's revised stocks.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 19,357,726 lb. which is a decrease of 5.4 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for July was 2.5 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 3,360,609 lb., a decrease of 703 thousand lb. from last year and an increase of 693 thousand lb. over last month.

The above figures include estimates for outstanding firms.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 10,690,209 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,014,338 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 19.7 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.2 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 981 thousand dozens for July 1940.

Shell eggs in transit at August 1, 1941 amounted to 88,380 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 6,714,630 lb. being 9.9 per cent less than the 1940 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 114 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 422 thousand lb. during July 1940.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at August 1, 1941 were 3,273,919 lb. being 20.8 per cent less than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 766,236 lb; fowl to 213,624 lb; and turkeys to 1,528,249 lb.

The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 722 thousand lb. as compared with 687 thousand lb. in July 1940.
