

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on January 1, 1942 was 44,096,136 lb. of which 42,847,336 lb. was Canadian make in Storage, and 1,240,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. In addition there were potential stocks of 1,007,415 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 30,009,702 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 12,757,634 lb. or 29.0 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 2,773,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 23.1 per cent, or 9.4 million lb., more than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December was 10.5 million lb. (being 20.1 per cent of the December 1 revised figures of holdings) as compared with a similar movement of 8.3 million lb. for December 1940.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1942 amounted to 147,801 lb. which was a decrease of 129,005 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 33,500,326 lb. of cheese. Adding 675,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 34,263,326 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 9.6 million lb. or 39.1 per cent over last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 4.6 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 2.9 million lb. for December 1940. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1941 was 11.9 per cent of the revised stocks for last month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk amounted to 14,248,923 lb. which was an increase of 2.5 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for December was 2.9 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,030,612 lb., a decrease of 2 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 493 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 318,284 dozens.


Fresh Eggs totalled 973, 332 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 69.6 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 96 thousand dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 334 thousand dozens for December 1940.

Shell eggs in transit at January 1, 1942 amounted to 220,950 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 4,305,793 lb. being 3 per cent less than the 1941 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 771 thousand lb. as compared with a similar movement of 663 thousand lb. during December 1940,

DRESSED POULTRY Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at January 1, 1942 were 19,797,706 lb. being 60,7 per cent more than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 8,058,460 lb; fowl to 2,914,016 lb; and turkeys to 6,556,833 lb,, not including the estimates. The net "Into-Storage" movement of all cressed poultry was 10,2 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 5.5 million ib. in December 1940.

STOCKS IN COLD STORAGES AND DAIRY FACTORIES IN CANADA, JAN. 1, 1942


