STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, NOVEMBER 1, 1942

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on November 1, 1942 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 43,862,153 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 42,714,153 lb; and 1,148,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 3,114,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the November 1 Summary shows a decrease of 13.2 million 1b. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 1,001,315 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 28,505,958 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 14,208,195 lb. or 33.3 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 33.4 per cent or 21.4 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of October was 9.3 million lb. (being 17.9 per cent of the October revised stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 3.7 million lb. for October 1941.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1942 amounted to 230,538 lb. which was an increase of 22,356 lb.

over last year.

CHEESE

With a Total of 67,551,885 lb. (including an estimate of 5,989,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, Cheese stocks showed an increase of 20.9 million lb., or 44.7 per cent, over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Into-Storage" movement for October 1942 was 4.9 million lb. (being 24.2 per cent of the preliminary figures for October production) as compared with a like movement of 2 million lb. a year ago.

A summary of cheese shows that, of the total, Canadian and Imported, only 35,065,034 lb. were available for domestic requirements, as 32,617,569 lb. wero held by the Dairy Products Board.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 11,263,521 lb. which was a decrease of 12.6 The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole million lb. from last year. Milk for October was 3.6 million 1b.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 3,106,119 lb., an increase of 955 thousand lb. over last year and a decrease of 62 thousand 1b. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 2,440,589 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 284,480 dozens.


Total Shell Eggs were 24.7 per cent less than last year at this time, The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 5.2 million dozens, as compared with a like movement of 4.9 million dozens for October 1941.

> Shell eggs in transit at November 1, 1942 amounted to 279,870 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 15,024,517 lb. being 155.9 por cent more than the 1941 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 1.5 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 761 thousand lb. during October 1941.

DRESSED POULTRY

On November 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 4,950,198 lb., being a decrease of 220,242 lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 982,700 lb; fowl to 1,232,027 lb; and turkeys to 653,524 lb., not including estimates. "Into-Storage" movements are shown for both years, 321 thousand lb. for October 1942 and 1.7 million lb. for the same date last year.



STOCKS IN COLD STORAGES AND DAIRY FACTORIES IN CANADA, NOVEMBER 1, 1942




