STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, FEBRUARY 1, 1942

CREAMERY BUTTER

The total of the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada at the opening of business on February 1, 1942 was 33,029,048 lb. of which 31,875,448 lb. was Canadian make in Storage, and 1,153,600 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. In addition there were potential stocks of 1,480,321 lb. held "In Bond". Of the Canadian butter in storage 22,006,005 lb. were held in cold storage warehouses and 9,869,443 lb. or 31.0 per cent in dairy factories. In these figures, however, there was included an estimate of 1,535,000 lb. for firms failing to report on time.

The Grand Total storage stocks of Canadian make were 17.7 per cent, or 4.8 million lb., more than last year. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of January was 10.8 million lb. (being 25.4 per cent of the January 1 revised figures of holdings) as compared with a similar movement of 6.4 million lb. for January 1941.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at February 1, 1942 amounted to 153,777 lb. which was a decrease of 35,516 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

Warehouses and dairy factories reported 25,450,454 lb. of cheese. Adding 468,000 lb. as the estimate for outstanding firms, a grand total of 25,918,454 lb. is shown.

These figures represent an increase of 4.4 million lb. or 20.7 per cent over last year, and a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 8.5 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 3.2 million lb. for January 1941. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for January 1942 was 24.7 per cent of the revised stocks for last month.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 8,202,810 lb. which was a decrease of 9,521 lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for January was 6.1 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,024,718 lb., a decrease of 1.1 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 322 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 147,444 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,227,428 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 13.2 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 57 thousand dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 324 thousand dozens for January 1941.

Shell eggs in transit at February 1, 1942 amounted to 1,001,640 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 3,687,033 lb. being 5.5 per cent less than the 1941 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 625 thousand lb. as compared with a similar movement of 541 thousand lb. during January 1941.

DRESSED POULTRY

Total stocks of all poultry reported and estimated at February 1, 1942 were 19,607,110 lb. being 66.0 per cent more than at the same date last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 7,693,557 lb; fowl to 2,440,208 lb; and turkeys to 6,965,443 lb., not including the estimates. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of all dressed poultry was 774 thousand lb. as compared with a similar movement of 508 thousand lb. in January 1941.
