STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1942

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1942 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 6,510,261 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 5,838,261 lb; and 672,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 383,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the May 1 Summary shows a decrease of 1.8 million lb. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 1,324,212 lb.

Dairy Factories had in store 3,864,055 lb. or 66.2 per cent. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held only 1,974,206 lb. This was an unusual situation but similar to that of 1938.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 39.4 per cent. or 3.8 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of April was 4.8 million lb. (being 45 per cent. of the April 1 revised figures of holdings) as compared with a similar movement of 953 thousand lb. for April 1941.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1942 amounted to 120,008 lb. which was an increase of 63,342 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

With a Total of 27,880,917 lb. (including an estimate of 583,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, Cheese stocks showed an increase of 12.3 million lb. or 78.6 per cent. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Into-Storage" movement for April 1942 was 8 million lb. (being 69 per cent. of the preliminary figures for April production) as compared with a like movement of 717 thousand lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 6,534,497 lb. which was an increase of 2.4 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for April was 466 thousand lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,128,958 lb., a decrease of 313 thousand lb. from last year and an increase of 255 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 9,977,744 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 2,669,673 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 110.6 per cent. more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 7.1 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 3.6 million dozens for April 1941.

Shell eggs in transit at May 1, 1942 amounted to 368,250 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 3,900,588 lb. being 13.3 per cent less than the 1941 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 1.2 million lb. as compared with 664 thousand lb. during April 1941.

DRESSED POULTRY

On May 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated showed an increase of 4,879,351 lb. over last year's figures, being 11,364,785 lb. Storage movements for both years showed net withdrawals; 2.9 million lb. during April 1942 and 1.9 million lb. during the same period last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,561,668 lb; fowl to 744,269 lb; and turkeys to 5,971,118 lb., not including estimates.
