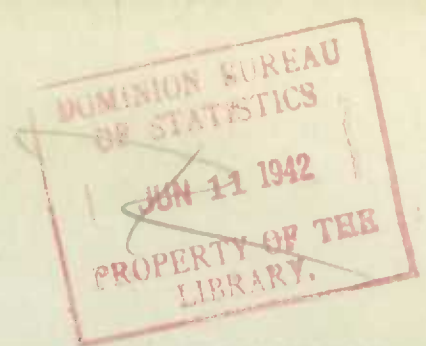

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JUNE 1, 1942

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on June 1, 1942 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 11,331,395 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 10,071,395 lb; and 1,260,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 588,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the June 1 Summary shows a decrease of 3.5 million lb. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 830,047 lb.

Dairy Factories had in store 6,738,437 lb. or 66.9 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 3,332,958 lb.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 45.6 per cent or 8.4 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May was 4.2 million lb. (being 14.4 per cent. of the May preliminary production figures) as compared with a similar movement of 8.9 million lb. for May 1941.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at June 1, 1942 amounted to 137,928 lb. which was an increase of 72,331 lb. over last year.

CHEESE

With a Total of 43,684,510 lb. (including an estimate of 2,025,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, Cheese stocks showed an increase of 19.3 million lb. or 79.5 per cent. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Into-Storage" movement for May 1942 was 14.7 million lb. (being 60.7 per cent. of the preliminary figures for May production) as compared with a like movement of 8.7 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 9,463,883 lb. which was a decrease of 1.1 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 2.9 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 2,005,385 lb., an increase of 32 thousand lb. over last year and an increase of 680 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 15,151,555 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 2,299,389 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 124.7 per cent. more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 4.7 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 1.8 million dozens for May 1941.

Shell eggs in transit at June 1, 1942 amounted to 353,520 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 7,767,476 lb. being 30.8 per cent more than the 1941 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 3.9 million lb. as compared with 1.4 million lb. during May 1941.

DRESSED POULTRY

On June 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated showed an increase of 4,175,677 lb. over last year's figures, being 9,174,533 lb. Storage movements for both years showed net withdrawals; 1.9 million lb. during May 1942 and 1.5 million lb. during the same period last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,394,615 lb; fowl to 423,208 lb; and turkeys to 5,066,389 lb., not including estimates.
