

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JULY 1, 1942

At the opening of business on July 1, 1942 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 28,014,766 lb. made up of Canadian make CREAMERY BUTTER in Storage 26,597,966 lb; and 1,416,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,678,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the July 1 Summary shows a decrease of 4.9 million 1b. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 772,982 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 15,433,973 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 11,163,993 lb. or 42 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 26.4 per cent or 9.5 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June was 16.6 million lb. (being 40 per cent of the June preliminary production figures) as compared with a similar movement of 17.6 million lb. for June 1941.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 1, 1942 amounted to DAIRY BUTTER 210,418 lb. which was an increase of only 4,128 lb. over last year.

With a Total of 62,566,727 lb. (including an estimate of 2,810,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, Cheese stocks showed an increase CHEESE of 28.6 million lb. or 84.2 per cent over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The not "Into-Storage" movement for June 1942 was 18.4 million 1b. (being 55.9 per cent of the preliminary figures for June production) as compared with a like movement of 9.6 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 7 million lb. amounted to 16,473,939 lb. which was a decrease of 883 thousand

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 2,753,267 lb., an increase of 86 thousand 1b. over last year and an increase of 506 thousand 1b. over last month.

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 15,544,417 dozens. EGGS

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,769,764 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 64.8 per cent more than last year at this time The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 483 thousand dozens, as compared with a net "Into-Storage" movement of 2.7 million dozens for June 1941.

Shell eggs in transit at July 1, 1942 amounted to 235,680 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 12,961,928 lb. being 96.4 per cent more than the 1941 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 5.2 million 1b. as compared with 665 thousand 1b. during June 1941.

DRESSED POULTRY On July 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 7,624,390 1b. being an increase of 3,625,721 lb. over last year's figures. Storage movements for both years showed net withdrawals; 1.5 million lb. during June 1942 and 1.0 million lb. during the same period last year. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,489,808 lb; fowl to 395,270 lb; and turkeys to 4,916,930 lb., not including estimates.






