

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JANUARY 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1943 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 22,806,950 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 21,630,950 lb; and 1,176,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 476,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the January 1 Summary shows a decrease of 15.7 million 1b. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 1,018,751 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 13,374,988 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 8,255,962 lb. or 38,2 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 49.4 per cent or 21.1 million 1b. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December was 9.3 million 1b. (being 30.1 per cent of the December revised stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 10.9 million 1b, for December 1942,

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1943 amounted to 132,509 lb. which was a decrease of 22,008 lb.

from last year.

CHEESE

With a Total of 56,053,635 lb. (including an estimate of 749,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories.

Cheese stocks showed an increase of 21.4 million lb., or 61.6 per cent, over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1942 was 4.1 million lb. (being 6.8 per cent of the revised December 1 Stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 4.2 million lb. a year ago.

A summary of cheese shows that, of the total, Canadian and Imported, only 36,263,041 lb. were available for domestic requirements, as 19,857,337 lb. were held by the Dairy Products Board.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 8,698,901 lb. which was a decrease of 5.6 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for December was 279,969 lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,845,036 lb., an increase of 485 thousand lb. over last year and 183 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 10,869 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,151,436 dozens.


Total Shell Eggs were 14.2 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a met "Into-Storage" movement of 437 thousand dozens, as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 33 thousand dozens for December 1941.

> Shell oggs in transit at January 1, 1943 amounted to 58,920 dozens.

Prozen eggs totalled 5,339,010 lb. being 23.8 per cent more than the 1942 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement was 5.8 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 765 thousand 1b. during December 1941.

DRESSED POULTRY

On January 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 14,198,892 lb., being a decrease of 6,328,503 lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,421,804 lb; fowl to 2,341,747 lb; and turkeys to 3,384,978 lb., not including estimates. "Into-Storage" movements are shown for both years; 5.5 million lb. for December 1942 and 10.9 million lb. for the same date last year.






