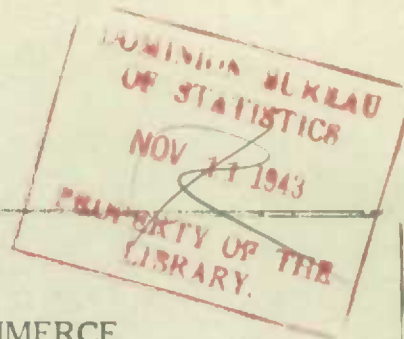

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, NOVEMBER 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on November 1, 1943 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 72,615,176 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 72,055,176 lb. and 560,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 449,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 629,169 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 52,834,071 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 19,221,105 lb. or 26.7 per cent.

Officials of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board observed that the trend of creamery butter production was less favourable during October due to diversion of milk to supply increased demands of urban fluid milk markets as well as to manufacture of cheese. It was stated that disappearance of butter during October had reached the highest point since the introduction of rationing last December, and though the heavy movement was due in part to completion of recent export shipments to the United Kingdom, actual domestic disappearance was the heaviest recorded this year. Reserve stocks declined about 6 million pounds during the month, but remained substantially higher than last year when an acute shortage was experienced. Officials stated that, despite lower production between this time and next spring such production plus current reserves should be adequate to maintain the eight ounce ration.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1943 amounted to 435,694 lb. which was an increase of 201,979 lb. over last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

CHEESE

With a total of 53,206,586 lb. (including an estimate of 873,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 14.7 million lb., or 21.7 per cent from the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for October 1943 was 3.5 million lb. (being 6.2 per cent of the revised October 1 stocks) as compared with a like movement of 4.7 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 11,224,588 lb. which was a decrease of 12,222 lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for October was 1,642,732 lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 2,096,989 lb. a decrease of 1,141,168 lb. from last year and a decrease of 1,038,106 lb. from last month. Casein in the hands of users is given in a footnote to page 4.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 214,854 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,046,896 dozens. The Total Shell Eggs were 53.8 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.3 million dozens, as compared with a like movement of 5.2 million dozens for October 1942. Shell Eggs in transit at November 1, 1943 amounted to 198,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 13,194,271 lb. being 13.9 per cent less than the 1942 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for October 1943 was 3.5 million lb. as compared with 1.3 million lb. during October 1942.

DRESSED POULTRY

On November 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 7,404,733 lb., being an increase of 2.3 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,365,749 lb.; fowl to 3,512,761 lb.; and turkeys to 99,033 lb.; not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 3.4 million lb. is shown for October 1943 while a like movement of 438 thousand lb. was shown for the same month last year.
