

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, DECEMBER 1, 1943

At the opening of business on December 1, 1943 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 59,687,929 lb. CREAMERY BUTTER made up of Canadian make in Storage 59,063,529 lb. and 624,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,480,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 385,004 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 49 954,113 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the rema ning 16,109,416 1b. or 27.3 per cent.

Officials of the Food Administration of the Wartine Prices and Trade Board express concern regarding the present trend of butter supplies. It is pointed out that production declined six per cent during November, while domestic disappearance reached a new high since the introduction of rationing. It was stated that while reserve stocks were reduced approximately thirteen million pounds during November they remained substantially higher at December 1 than at the same date last year when the shortage was acute.

The stocks of this commodity as reported at December 1, 1943 amounted to 190,234 lb. which was an increase of 3,128 lb. DAIRY BUTTER over last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

With a total of 47,825,185 lb. (including an estimate of CHEESE 864,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 12.2 million 1b., or 20.4 per cent from the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for November 1943 was 5.4 million lb. (being 10.1 per cent of the revised November 1 stocks) as compared with a like movement of 7.9 million lb. a year ago.

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS amounted to 7,772,356 lb. which was a decrease of 1.2 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for November was 3,452,232 lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 1,406,883 lb. a decrease of 1,255,038 lb. from last year and a decrease of 700,406 lb. from last month. Casein in the hands of users is given in a footnote to page 4.

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 82,445 dozens. Fresh EGGS Eggs totalled 497,842 dozens. The Total Shell Eggs were 20.2 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 687 thousand dozens, as compared with a like movement of 2.0 million dozens for November 1942. Shell Eggs in transit at December 1, 1943 amounted to 36,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 9,604,317 lb. being 14.0 per cent less than the 1942 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for November 1943 was 3.9 million 1b. as compared with 4.2 million 1b. during November 1942.

On December 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated DRESSED POULTRY were 15,451,120 lb., being an increase of 6.8 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,770,178 lb.; fowl to 5,978,837 lb.; and turkeys to 218,812 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 7.8 million 1b. is shown for November 1943 while a like movement of 3.6 million 1b. was shown for the same month last reac.
