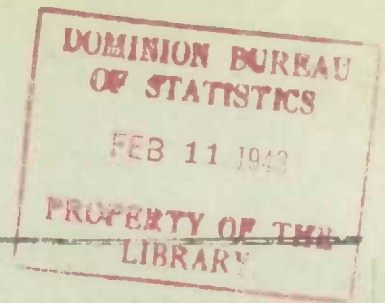

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, FEBRUARY 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on February 1, 1943 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 15,181,918 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 14,129,118 lb; and 1,052,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 550,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the February 1 Summary shows a decrease of 14.3 million lb. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 997,591 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 7,099,435 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 7,029,683 lb. or 49.7 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 55.5 per cent or 17.6 million lb. The net "Out of Storage" movement for the month of January was 7.7 million lb. (being 35.4 per cent of the January revised stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 11.0 million lb. for January 1942.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at February 1, 1943 amounted to 122,937 lb. which was a decrease of 29,861 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

With a total of 48,244,889 lb. (including an estimate of 397,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories. Cheese stocks showed an increase of 21.8 million lb., or 82.6 per cent, over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Out of Storage" movement for January 1943 was 8.0 million lb. (being 14.2 per cent of the revised January 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 8.3 million lb. a year ago.

Owing to the Dairy Products Bond requisitioning quantities of cheese at the month end data are not available of the amount held by the Board for the British Ministry of Food.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 7,323,939 lb. which was a decrease of 1.6 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out of Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for January was 1.0 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,806,728 lb., an increase of 403,314 lb. over last year and a decrease of 174,954 lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 1,400,659 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,578,441 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 115.0 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into Storage" movement of 1.8 million dozens, as compared with a like Storage movement of 30,000 dozens for January 1942.

Shell eggs in transit at February 1, 1943 amounted to 250,410 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 2,791,372 lb. being 24.2 per cent less than the 1942 figures. The net "Out of Storage" movement was 2.6 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 629,000 lb. during January 1942.

DRESSED POULTRY

On February 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 11,719,247 lb., being a decrease of 8.0 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,116,681 lb; fowl to 1,643,791 lb; and turkeys to 3,610,790 lb., not including estimates. "Out of Storage" movements are shown for both years; 2.7 million lb. for January 1943 and 826,000 lb. for the same month last year.
