

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, APRIL 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1943 the Summary of

Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 9,877,682 lb. made up

of Canadian make in Storage 8,939,682 lb; and 938,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the

railway companies. Included in these figures were 447,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the April 1 Summary shows a decrease of 1,2 million 1b, Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included shows a decrease of 1,2 million 1b, Potential in these figures, were reported as 2,016,697 lb.

Dairy factories had in store 5,346,419 lb. or 59.8 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the . remaining 3,593,263 lb.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were lower than last year by 15.7 per cent or 1.7 million 1b. The not "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of March was 2.4 million 1b. (being 20.9 per cent of the March 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 9.7 million 1b. for March 1942.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at April 1, 1943 amounted to 63,183 lb. which was a decrease of 64,879 lb.

from last year.

With a total of 18,436,800 lb. (including an estimate of CHEESE 299,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 1.7 million lb., or 8.5 per cent, under the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Out of Storage" movement for March 1943 was 8.9 million lb. (being 32.5 per cent of the revised March 1 stock figures) as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 1.7 million lb. a year ago.

A summary of cheese shows that, of the total, Canadian and Imported, only 15,234,274 lb. were available for domestic requirements, as 3,296,000 lb. were held by the Dairy Products Board,

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 6,805,177 lb, which was a decrease of 195,801 lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 2,1 million 1b.

The chief by product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,133,944 lb. an increase of 246,870 lb. over last year and a decrease of 165,362 lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storago Eggs came to a total of 1,001,577 dozens.


Fresh Eggs totalled 2,069,042 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 44,6 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 133 thousand dozens, as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 2,6 million dozens for March 1942.

Shell eggs in transit at April 1, 1943 amounted to 103,110 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 3,036,435 lb. being 10.6 per cent more than the 1942 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement was 430 thousand lb. as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 388 thousand lb. during March 1942.


DRESSED POULTRY On April 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 6,503,224 lb., being a decrease of 7.9 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,744,807 lb; fowl to 595,745 lb; and turkeys to 2,434,039 lb., not including estimates. "Out-of-Storage" movements are shown for both years; 3.1 million lb. for March 1943 and 2.6 million lb. for the same month last year






