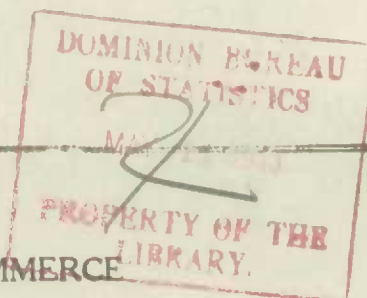

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1943 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 11,337,644 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 10,021,644 lb; and 1,316,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 712,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the May 1 Summary shows an increase of 2.9 million lb. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 1,704,923 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 5,248,790 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 4,772,854 lb. or 47.6 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were higher than last year by 70.5 per cent or 4.1 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of April was 1.1 million lb. (being 4.6 per cent of the April preliminary production figures) as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 4.7 million lb. for April 1942. This is the first time that May 1 stocks have been higher than those of April.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1943 amounted to 51,931 lb. which was a decrease of 68,150 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

With a total of 17,212,331 lb. (including an estimate of 549,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 11.8 million lb., or 40.7 per cent, under the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for April 1943 was 1.3 million lb. (being 7.0 per cent of the revised April 1 stock figures) as compared with an "Into-Storage" movement of 8.9 million lb. a year ago.

A summary of cheese shows that, of the total, Canadian and Imported, 16,339,828 lb. were available for domestic requirements, as 969,500 lb. were held by the Dairy Products Board.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 8,103,426 lb. which was an increase of 1,568,929 lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for April was 1.3 million lb.

The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 1,343,620 lb. an increase of 217,752 lb. over last year and an increase of 192,252 lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 2,304,599 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 2,690,699 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 61.0 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.9 million dozens, as compared with a like movement of 7.3 million dozens for April 1942.

Shell eggs in transit at May 1, 1943 amounted to 309,330 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 4,771,193 lb. being 22.2 per cent more than the 1942 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for April 1943 was 1.7 million lb. as compared with 1.2 million lb. during April 1942.

DRESSED POULTRY

On May 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 4,081,101 lb. being a decrease of 7.1 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,602,136 lb; fowl to 328,031; and turkeys to 1,717,663 lb., not including estimates. "Out-of-Storage" movements are shown for both years; 2.6 million lb. for April 1943 and 3.3 million lb. for the same month last year.
