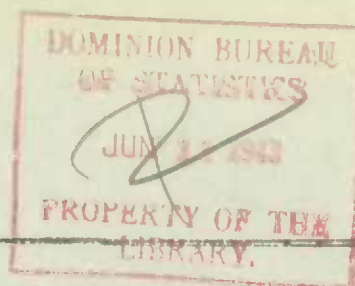

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JUNE 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on June 1, 1943 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 19,543,285 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 18,591,285 lb. and 952,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 604,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the June 1 Summary shows an increase of 4.5 million lb. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 1,439,708 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 10,752,250 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 7,839,035 lb. or 42.2 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were higher than last year by 85.2 per cent or 8.6 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May was 8.6 million lb. (being 26.9 per cent of the May preliminary production figures) as compared with a similar movement of 4.8 million lb. for May 1942.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at June 1, 1943 amounted to 61,258 lb. which was a decrease of 63,340 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

With a total of 24,552,282 lb. (including an estimate of 768,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 20 million lb., or 45 per cent, under the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Into-Storage" movement for May 1943 was 7.2 million lb. (being 50.4 per cent of the preliminary May production figures) as compared with a like movement of 15.6 million lb. a year ago.

Stocks of cheese held by the Dairy Products Board are not now available for publication.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 8,486,818 lb. which was a decrease of 977,737 lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 333,202 lb.

The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 1,885,230 lb. a decrease of 361,828 lb. from last year and an increase of 471,804 lb. over last month.

Casein in the hands of users is given in a footnote on page 4.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 3,220,804 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 3,447,083 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 37.4 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 1.6 million dozens, as compared with a like movement of 5.0 million dozens for May 1942.

Shell eggs in transit at June 1, 1943 amounted to 220,950 dozens.

Frozen eggs totalled 9,781,854 lb. being 25.9 per cent more than the 1942 figures. The net "Into Storage" movement for May 1943 was 5.0 million lb. as compared with 3.9 million lb. during May 1942.

DRESSED POULTRY

On June 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 2,738,563 lb. being a decrease of 6.5 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,017,410 lb.; fowl to 236,927 lb.; and turkeys to 1,145,518 lb., not including estimates. "Out-of-Storage" movements are shown for both years; 1.3 million lb. for May 1943 and 1.9 million lb. for the same month last year.
