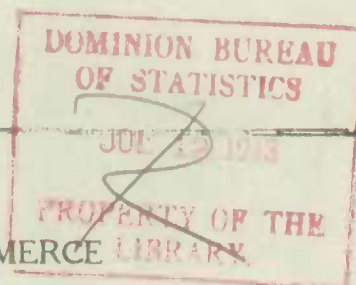

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JULY 1, 1943

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1943 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 41,843,465 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 40,835,465 lb. and 1,008,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,406,000 lb. as an estimate for firms who did not report on time. When compared with the five-year average the July 1 Summary shows an increase of 8.7 million lb. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 1,218,156 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 26,718,627 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 14,116,838 lb. or 34.6 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were higher than last year by 53.1 per cent or 14.2 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June was 22.1 million lb. (being 47.4 per cent of the June preliminary production figures) as compared with a similar movement of 16.8 million lb. for June 1942.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 1, 1943 amounted to 71,296 lb. which was a decrease of 151,200 lb. from last year.

CHEESE

With a total of 42,934,853 lb. (including an estimate of 1,184,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 20.1 million lb., or 31.9 per cent, under the stocks for the same date a year ago. The net "Into-Storage" movement for June 1943 was 18.1 million lb. (being 67.3 per cent of the preliminary June production figures) as compared with a like movement of 18.4 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 11,138,918 lb. which was a decrease of 5,341,620 lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 2,643,601 lb.

The chief by-product, Skim-Milk powder, amounted to 2,815,040 lb. a decrease of 393,885 lb. from last year and an increase of 883,971 lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 2,460,442 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 2,961,399 dozens.

Total Shell Eggs were 69.2 per cent less than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.3 million dozens, as compared with a like movement of 232 thousand dozens for June 1942.

Shell eggs in transit at July 1, 1943 amounted to 265,140.

Frozen eggs totalled 17,138,263 lb. being 30.6 per cent more than the 1942 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for June 1943 was 5.7 million lb. as compared with 5.4 million lb. during June 1942.

DRESSED POULTRY

On July 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 1,831,172 lb. being a decrease of 5.8 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 531,542 lb.; fowl to 208,248 lb.; and turkeys to 713,950 lb. not including estimates. "Out-of-Storage" movement are shown for both years; 891 thousand lb. for June 1943 and 1.6 million lb. for the same month last year.
