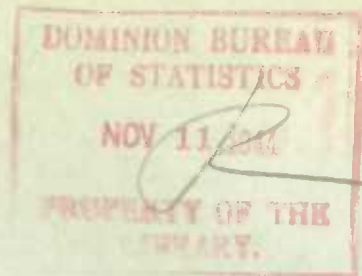

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, NOVEMBER 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on November 1, 1944 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 63,806,367 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 63,071,367 lb. and 735,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,653,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 46,272,417 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 16,798,950 lb. or 26.6 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 8.8 million lb. but was 5.6 million lb. above the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of October was 3.7 million lb. (being 5.6 per cent of the October 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 4.1 million lb. for October 1943

Of the storage stocks the Dairy Products Board owned  
1,785,896 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1944 amounted to 88,247 lb. which was a decrease of 352,605 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 210,654 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 53,353,065 lb. (including an estimate of 1,155,000 lb. held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed an increase of 171 thousand lb. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 3,838,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for October 1944 was 11.2 million lb. (being 17.4 per cent of the October 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.9 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 35,502,566 lb. which was an increase of 24.3 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for October was 560 thousand lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 3,799,169 lb. an increase of 1.7 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 116 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 3,486,310 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,379,516 dozens. Shell eggs in stock were 4,865,826 dozens on November 1, as compared with 10,784,697 dozens on October 1. Shell Eggs in transit at November 1, 1944 amounted to 414,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 43,706,813 lb. being 222.8 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for October 1944 was 723 thousand lb. as compared with 3.2 million lb. during October 1943.

DRESSED POULTRY

On November 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 14,025,972 lb., being an increase of 6.4 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,375,788 lb., fowl to 7,235,395 lb.; and turkeys to 566,143 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 2.2 million lb. is shown for October 1944 as compared with a like movement of 3.6 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 150,000 lb. in transit on November 1.
