

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, DECEMBER 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on December 1, 1944 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 52,298,446 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 51,499,048 lb. and 799,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,011,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Gold Storage warehouses had in store 37,130,537 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 14,362,509 1b or 27 9 per cent

The summary total was less than last year by 7.2 million 1b The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of November was 11 6 million 1b (being 18.4 per cent of the November 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 13,1 million lb. for November 1943.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at December 1, 1944 amounted to 133,313 lb. which was a decrease of

58,617 lb. from last year

WHEY BUTTER

There were 145,285 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 42,999,714 lb. (including an estimate of 1,201,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 4.6 million 1b. from the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 6,194,000 1b. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for November 1944 was 10.5 million 1b. (being 19.6 per cent of the November 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 5,6 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufactur ers amounted to 33,658,979 lb, which was an increase of 25.9 million 1b. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for November was 1.8 million 1b. The chief by-product Skim-Wilk Powder, amounted to 5,183,555 lb. an increase of 1.8 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 616 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 537,749 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,313,980 dozens. Shell eggs in stock were 1,851,729 dozens on December 1, as compared with 4,820,502 dozens on November 1. Shell-Eggs in transit at December 1, 1944 amounted to 252,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 37,846,328 lb., being 294,4 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for November 1944 was 5.5 million 1b. as compared with 3.9 million 1b. during November 1943. The Special Products Board holdings on December 1 were 28,918,428 1b.

DRESSED POULTRY

On December 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 18,450,755 lb., being an increase of 2.9 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 7,745,964 lb., fowl to 7,706,477 land turkeys to 541,716 lb., not including estimates. An"Into-Storage" movement of 4.5 million 1b, is shown for November 1944 as compared with a like movement of 7.9 million 1b. for the same month last year.

There were also 425,000 lb. in transit on December 1.
