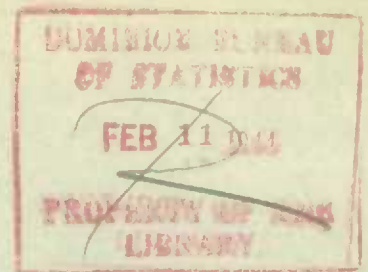

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, FEBRUARY 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on February 1, 1944 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 33,533,697 lb., made of Canadian make in Storage 32,893,897 lb. and 639,800 lb. in Car-loads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 326,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 174,344 lb.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 22,753,721 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 10,140,176 lb. or 30.8 per cent.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were higher than last year by 18.7 million lb. but only 4.1 million lb. above the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of January was 12.8 million lb. (being 28.0 per cent of the revised January 1 stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 7.7 million lb. for January 1943.

Of the storage stocks the Dairy Products Board owned 7,020,272 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at February 1, 1944 amounted to 97,910 lb. which was a decrease of 25,104 lb. from last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 137,120 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 30,613,336 lb. (including an estimate of 269,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories cheese stocks showed a decrease of 17.9 million lb., or 36.9 per cent from the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 2,584,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for January 1944 was 8.5 million lb. (being 21.8 per cent of the revised January 1 stocks) as compared with a like movement of 7.9 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 5,381,867 lb. which was a decrease of 2.0 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for January was 1.5 million lb. The chief by-product, Skin-Milk Powder, amounted to 851,382 lb. a decrease of 974 thousand lb. from last year and a decrease of 284 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 954,900 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,346,704 dozens. The total Shell Eggs were 37.8 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 2.5 million dozens, as compared with a like movement of 2.0 million dozens for January 1943. Shell Eggs in transit at February 1, 1944 amounted to 252,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 5,708,918 lb. being 100.4 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for January 1944 was 840 thousand lb. as compared with 2.5 million lb. during January 1943.

DRESSED POULTRY

On February 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 26,931,907 lb., being an increase of 14.9 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 10,105,736 lb.; fowl to 7,058,223 lb.; and turkeys to 4,409,365 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 2.1 million lb. is shown for January 1944 as compared with an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.4 million lb. for the same month last year.
