

#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, APRIL 1, 1944

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1944 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 11,380,817 1b., made up of Canadian make in Storage 10,575,817 1b. and 805,000 1b. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 706,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 51,160 lb.

Dairy factories had in store 5,707,017 lb. or 54 0 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 4,868,800 lb.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were higher than last year by 1.5 million 1b. but 484 thousand 1b. lower than the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of March was 8.7 million 1b. (being 45.2 per cent of the revised March 1 stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 2.4 million 1b. for March 1943.

DAIRY BUTTER

April 1, 1944 amounted to 87,706 lb. which was an increase of 10,276 lb. over last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Derporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

With a total of 20,207,427 lb. (including an estimate of 481,000 lb.) held by warehouses and

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for

dairy factories, cheese stocks showed an increase of 1.6 million 1b. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 418,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for March 1944 was 7.6 million 1b. (being 27.3 per cent of the revised March 1 stocks) as compared with a like movement of 8.8 million lb. a year ago.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

manufacturers amounted to 5,663,924 lb. which was a decrease of 1.2 million 1b. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 1.8 million 1b. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 688,903 lb. a decrease of 465 thousand lb. from last year and a decrease of 85 thousand 1b. from last month.

#### EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 3,404,290 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,052,305 dozens. The total Shell Eggs were 3.4 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 317 thousand dozens, as compared with an opposite movement of 151 thousand dozens for March 1943. Shell Eggs in transit at April 1, 1944 amounted to 324,000 dozens.

per cent more than the 1943 figures. Frozen Eggs totalled 13,277,401 1b. being 310.8 The net "Into-Storage" movement for March 1944 was 6.2 million 1b. as compared with 626 thousand 1b. during March 1943.

#### DRESSED POULTRY

On April 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 20,286,979 lb., being an increase

of 13.6 million 1b. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 7,610,273 1b. fowl to 6,151,442 lb.; and turkeys to 4,240,143 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.0 million 1b. is shown for the month of March for both years
