

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, APRIL 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1944 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 11,380,817 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 10,575,817 lb. and 805,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 706,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 51,160 lb.

Dairy factories had in store 5,707,017 lb. or 54.0 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 4,968,800 lb.

Total storage stocks of Canadian make were higher than last year by 1.6 million lb. but 484 thousand lb. lower than the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of March was 8.7 million lb. (being 45.2 per cent of the revised March 1 stock figures) as compared with a similar movement of 2.4 million lb. for March 1943.

There were no stocks held in storage for the Dairy Products Board.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at April 1, 1944 amounted to 87,706 lb. which was an increase of 10,276 lb. over last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 110,507 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 20,207,427 lb. (including an estimate of 481,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed an increase of 1.6 million lb. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 418,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for March 1944 was 7.6 million lb. (being 27.3 per cent of the revised March 1 stocks) as compared with a like movement of 8.8 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 5,663,924 lb. which was a decrease of 1.2 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 1.8 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 688,903 lb. a decrease of 465 thousand lb. from last year and a decrease of 85 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 3,404,290 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,052,305 dozens. The total Shell Eggs were 3.4 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Out-of-Storage" movement of 317 thousand dozens, as compared with an opposite movement of 151 thousand dozens for March 1943. Shell Eggs in transit at April 1, 1944 amounted to 324,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 13,277,401 lb. being 310.8 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for March 1944 was 6.2 million lb. as compared with 626 thousand lb. during March 1943.

DRESSED POULTRY

On April 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 20,286,979 lb., being an increase of 13.6 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 7,610,273 lb. fowl to 6,151,442 lb.; and turkeys to 4,240,143 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.0 million lb. is shown for the month of March for both years.
