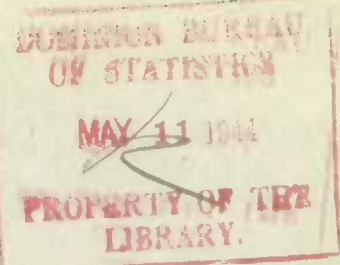

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1944 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 9,282,697 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 8,022,697 lb. and 1,260,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 352,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. Potential stocks of butter "In Bond", not included in these figures, were reported as 51,704 lb.

Dairy factories had in store 4,953,044 lb. or 61.7 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 3,069,653 lb.

The summary total was less than last year by 2.0 million lb., and 366 thousand lb. below the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of April was 2.6 million lb. (being 24.6 per cent of the revised April 1 stock figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 988 thousand lb. for April 1943.

There were no stocks held in storage for the Dairy Products Board.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1944 amounted to 78,287 lb. which was an increase of 16,021 lb. over last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 94,565 lb. of the product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 18,705,050 lb. (including an estimate of 431,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories cheese stocks showed an increase of 1.2 million lb. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 152,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for April 1944 was 1.5 million lb. (being 7.2 per cent of the revised April 1 stocks) as compared with a like movement of 1.1 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 8,539,119 lb. which was an increase of 386 thousand lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole for April was 2.9 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 1,233,505 lb. a decrease of 180 thousand lb. from last year but an increase of 557 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 5,926,227 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 4,449,800 dozens. The total Shell Eggs were 102.8 per cent more than last year at this time. The figures show a net "Into-Storage" movement of 3.7 million dozens, as compared with a similar movement of 2.0 million dozens for April 1943. Shell Eggs in transit at May 1, 1944 amounted to 414,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 21,393,286 lb. being 301.3 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for April 1944 was 8.1 million lb. as compared with 2.1 million lb. during April 1943.

DRESSED POULTRY

On May 1 total poultry stocks reported an estimated were 16,096,855 lb., being an increase of 12.0 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,968,501 lb. fowl to 4,755,760 lb.; and turkeys to 3,929,370 lb., not including estimates. "Out-of-Storage" movements are shown for both years; 4.1 million lb. for April 1944 and 2.6 million lb. for April 1943.
