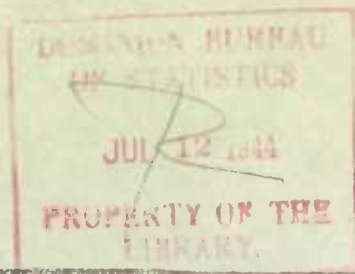

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JULY 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1944 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 37,512,604 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 36,182,604 lb. and 1,330,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,194,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 22,397,457 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 13,785,147 lb. or 38.1 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 4.6 million lb., but was 2.7 million lb. above the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June was 19.6 million lb. (being 42.9 per cent of the June Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 22.3 million lb. for June 1943.

Of the storage stocks the Dairy Products Board owned 766,784 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at July 1, 1944 amounted to 103,766 lb. which was a decrease of 14,849 lb. from last year. Stocks for the Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited are included as reported by firms.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 146,102 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 51,693,631 lb. (including an estimate of 3,184,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed an increase of 7.5 million lb. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 418,000 lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for June 1944 was 17.7 million lb. (being 57.2 per cent of the June Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 19.0 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS.

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 25,772,470 lb. which was an increase of 14.6 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 11.0 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 2,655,388 lb. a decrease of 323 thousand lb. from last year but an increase of 819 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 8,891,925 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 11,230,517 dozens. Shell eggs in stock increased rapidly this year, there being 20,122,442 dozens on July 1. Some 3 million dozens of these are held temporarily in establishments not usually used for egg storage. Shell Eggs in transit at July 1, 1944 amounted to 810,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 36,586,510 lb. being 129.2 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for June 1944 was 6.9 million lb. as compared with 5.5 million lb. during June 1943.

DRESSED POULTRY

On July 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 10,231,110 lb., being an increase of 8.4 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,487,887 lb., fowl to 3,168,783 lb.; and turkeys to 2,571,412 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.5 million lb. is shown for June 1944 as compared with a similar movement of 893 thousand lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 25,000 lb. in transit on July 1.
