STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, AUGUST 1, 1944

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on August 1, 1944 the summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 33,888,736 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 52,828,936 lb. and 1,059,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,234,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 36,487,063 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 16,341,873 lb. or 30.9 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 9 million lb., but was 2.9 million lb. above the 5-year average 1939-43. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of July was 16.3 million lb. (being 39.2 per cent of the July Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 20.6 million lb. for July, 1943.

Of the storage stocks the Dairy Products Board owned 1,563,744 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at August 1, 1944 amounted to 106,491 lb. which was a decrease of 198,224 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 218,672 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 59,939,185 lb. (including an estimate of 1,413,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed an increase of 8.3 million lb. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 342,000 lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for July, 1944 was 7.3 million lb. (being 26.0 per cent of the July Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 7.4 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS.

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 35,868,859 lb. which was an increase of 23.1 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for July was 10 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 3,432,245 lb. a decrease of 469 thousand lb. from last year but an increase of 790 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 14,953,920 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,810,715 dozens. Shell eggs in stock were 18,764,635 dozens on August 1, as compared with 21,436,745 dozens on July 1. Shell Eggs in transit at August 1, 1944 amounted to 306,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 42,630,289 lb. being 134.0 per cent more than the 1943 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for July, 1944 was 5.8 million lb. as compared with 1.0 million lb. during July, 1943.

DRESSED POULTRY

On August 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 9,945,188 lb., being an increase of 8.1 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,374,128 lb., fowl to 3,453,167 lb.; and turkeys to 2,503,969 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 291 thousand lb. is shown for July, 1944 as compared with an opposite movement of 38 thousand lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 50,000 lb. in transit on August 1.
