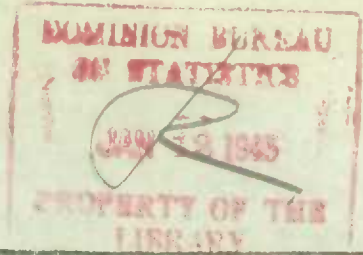

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JANUARY 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 40,821,153 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 40,037,153 lb. and 784,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 929,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 27,337,147 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 12,700,006 lb. or 31.6 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 5.6 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December was 11.8 million lb. (being 22.7 per cent of the December 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 13.3 million lb. for December 1943. The five-year average was 37,832,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1945 amounted to 123,794 lb. which was an increase of only 544 lb. over last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 112,467 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

With a total of 39,320,424 lb. (including an estimate of 555,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed an increase of 95 thousand lb. over the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 1,026,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1944 was 3.0 million lb. (being 7.1 per cent of the December 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 8.4 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 33,158,277 lb. which was an increase of 26.3 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for December was 501 thousand lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 3,172,216 lb. an increase of 2.0 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 12 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 230,665 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,687,077 dozens. Shell eggs in stock were 3,917,742 dozens on January 1, as compared with 1,847,347 dozens on December 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at January 1, 1945 amounted to 666,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 29,095,995 lb., being 344.3 per more than the 1944 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1944 was 8.7 million lb. as compared with 3.0 million lb. during December 1943. The Special Products Board holdings on January 1 were 23,319,284 lb.

DRESSED POULTRY

On January 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 23,919,630 lb., being a decrease of 898 thousand lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 10,380,343 lb., fowl to 7,936,544 lb. and turkeys to 3,053,941 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 5.1 million lb. is shown for December 1944 as compared with a like movement of 9.3 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 275,000 lb. in transit on January 1.
