STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, OCTOBER 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 71,040,175 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 70,275,775 lb. and 764,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,786,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 49,990,286 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 20,285,489 lb., or 28.9 per cent.

The summary total was more than last year by 3.2 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of September was 3.3 million lb. (being 10.7 per cent of the September production figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.7 million lb. for September 1944. The five-year average of stocks was 65,546,000 lb. Of the current total the Dairy Products Board held 3,850,896 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at October 1, 1945 amounted to 56,726 lb. which was a decrease of 39,606 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 354,247 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 63,024,192 lb. consisting of 61,907,648 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,571,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 14,544 lb. imported and 1,102,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 2.8 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of October 1, 1944. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for September was 2.2 million lb. (being 3.4 per cent of the September 1 stock figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 3.4 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 39,513,160 lb. which was an increase of 2.7 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 8.1 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 5,611,069 lb., an increase of 1.6 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 674 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 11,222,637 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,045,045 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 13,267,682 dozens on October 1, as compared with 10,791,572 dozens on October 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at October 1, 1945 amounted to 1,512,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 27,308,966 lb. being 38.5 per cent less than the 1944 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for September 1945 was 1.9 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 530 thousand lb. during September 1944. The Special Products Board held 16,395,923 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On October 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 6,370,557 lb., being a decrease of 5.5 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,278,504 lb., fowl to 2,800,283 lb. and turkeys to 419,970 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 756 thousand lb. is shown for September 1945 as compared with a like movement of 1.7 million lb. for the same month last year.
