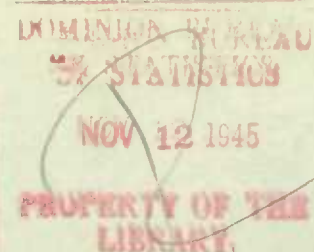

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, NOVEMBER 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on November 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 64,219,915 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 63,729,915 lb. and 490,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,575,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 45,871,218 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 17,858,697 lb. or 28.0 per cent.

The summary total was more than last year by 400 thousand lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of October was 7.1 million lb. (being 10.0 per cent of the October revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.6 million lb. for October 1944. The five-year average of stocks was 59,633,000 lb. Of the current total the Dairy Products Board held 3,796,016 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1945 amounted to 42,610 lb. which was a decrease of 43,516 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 335,302 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 54,939,433 lb. consisting of 54,815,448 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,504,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 9,985 lb. imported and 114,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was an increase of 1.3 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of November 1, 1944. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for October was 7.2 million lb. (being 11.7 per cent of the October 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 11.2 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 32,857,204 lb. which was a decrease of 2.6 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for Ontario was 6.7 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 4,403,260 lb., an increase of 469 thousand lb. over last year and a decrease of 1.2 million lb. from last month or 21.5 per cent.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 4,797,135 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 599,819 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 5,396,954 dozens on November 1, as compared with 4,874,345 dozens on November 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at November 1, 1945 amounted to 540,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 22,112,818 lb. being 49.0 per cent less than the 1944 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for October 1945 was 5.2 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.1 million lb. during October 1944. The Special Products Board held 13,129,325 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On November 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 9,820,428 lb., being a decrease of 4.3 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,496,814 lb., fowl to 5,979,624 lb. and turkeys to 177,633 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 3.4 million lb. is shown for October 1945 as compared with a like movement of 2.3 million lb. for the same month last year.

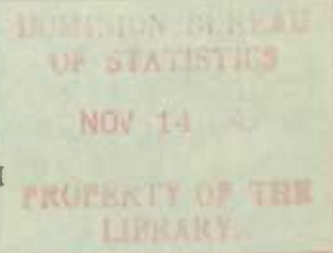
