STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, DECEMBER 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on December 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 51,799,171 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 51,244,671 lb. and 554,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,617,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 36,603,073 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 14,641,598 lb. or 28.6 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 773 thousand lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of November was 13.4 million lb. (being 20.7 per cent of the November 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 11.3 million lb. for November 1944. The five-year average of stocks was 48,212,000 lb. Of the current total the Dairy Products Board held 3,750,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at December 1, 1945 amounted to 14,383 lb. which was a decrease of 124,474 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 255,418 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 45,606,198 lb. consisting of 43,085,458 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,339,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 12,740 lb. imported and 2,508,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was an increase of 862 thousand lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of December 1, 1944. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for November was 11.7 million lb. (being 21.4 per cent of the November 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 11.3 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 24,250,252 lb. which was a decrease of 9.4 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for November was 8.9 million lb. The chief by-product Skin-Milk Powder amounted to 2,794,572 lb., a decrease of 472 thousand lb. from last year and a decrease of 1.8 million lb. from last month or 39.3 per cent.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of only 870 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 527,396 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 528,266 dozens on December 1, as compared with 1,855,714 dozens on December 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at December 1, 1945 amounted to 144,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 14,246,751 lb. being 62.4 per cent less than the 1944 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for November, 1945 was 8.9 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 5.5 million lb. during November 1944. The Special Products Board held 6,876,754 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On December 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 15,205,623 lb., being a decrease of 3.5 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,593,805 lb., fowl to 6,636,671 lb. and turkeys to 367,700 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 5.4 million lb. is shown for November 1945 as compared with a like movement of 4.6 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 175,000 lb. dressed poultry in carloads on December 1, 1945.
