STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, FEB. 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on February 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 30,618,570 lb., made up of Canadian make in Storage 30,303,570 lb. and 315,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,387,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 19,300,350 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 11,003,220 lb. or 36.3 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 2.7 million lb. The net "Out-of Storage" movement for the morth of January was 9.7 million lb. (being 24.3 per cent of the January 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 12.8 million lb. for January 1944. The five-year average was 28,470,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at February 1, 1945 amounted to 100,098 lb. which was a decrease of only 154 lb.

from last year.

THEY BUTTER

There were 89,757 lb. of this product on hand.

With a total of 29 737,416 lb (including an estimate of 376,000 lb.) held by warehouses and dairy factories, cheese stocks showed a decrease of 946 thousand lb. from the stocks for the same date a year ago. The cheese reported as in the hands of the railway companies totalled 2,660,000 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for January 1945 was 9 6 million lb. (being 24.3 per cent of the January 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 8.5 million lb. a year ago.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evapor, and Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 22,837,615 lb, which was an increase of 17.5 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Out of Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for January was 9.6 million lb. The chief by product Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 3,206,813 lb. an increase of 2.3 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 24 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 404,055 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 2,846,437 dozens. Shell eggs in stock were 3,250,492 dozens on February 1, as compared with 4,310,210 dozens on February 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at February 1, 1945 amounted to 2,682,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 24,335,018 lb., being 328.1 per cent more than the 1944 figures. The net "Out of Storage" movement for January 1945 was 5.9 million lb. as compared with 865 thousand lb. during January 1944. The Special Products Board holdings on February 1 were 17,507,910 lb.

DRESSED FOULTRY

On February 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 21,073,527 lb., being a decrease of 5.7 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 8,791,520 lb., fowl to 6,178,448 lb. and turkeys to 3,955,499 lb., not including estimates. An "Out of Storage" movement of 3.1 million lb. is shown for January 1945 as compared with an opposite movement of 2.0 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 175,000 lb, in transit on February 1.
