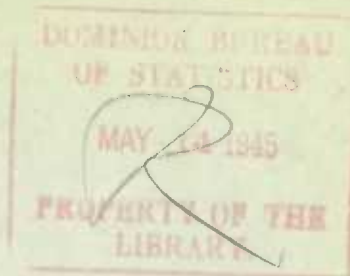

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 12,540,767 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 11,991,967 lb. and 548,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 558,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy factories had in store 6,238,011 lb. or 52.0 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while Cold Storage warehouses held the remaining 5,753,956 lb.

The summary total was more than last year by 3.2 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of April was 874 thousand lb. (being 6.8 per cent of the April 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 2.6 million lb. for April 1944. The five-year average of stocks was 9,553,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1945 amounted to 69,275 lb. which was a decrease of 10,931 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 65,003 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

The Summary total of cheese was 25,315,318 lb., consisting of 25,254,566 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,127,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 22,752 lb. Imported and 38,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was an increase of 5.8 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of May 1, 1944. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for April was 5.1 million lb. (being 54.6 per cent of the April production figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 855 thousand lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 22,580,086 lb. which was a decrease of 14.0 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for April was 2.5 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 3,810,242 lb., an increase of 2.5 million lb. over last year and an increase of 744 thousand lb. over last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 7,107,340 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 5,916,704 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 13,024,044 dozens on May 1, as compared with 10,497,874 dozens on May 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at May 1, 1945 amounted to 2,394,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 11,664,621 lb. being 45.5 per cent less than the 1944 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for April 1945 was 234 thousand lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 8.1 million lb. during April 1944.

DRESSED POULTRY

On May 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 8,105,657 lb., being a decrease of 8.1 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,556,399 lb., fowl to 1,981,279 lb. and turkeys to 2,885,491 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 8.0 million lb. is shown for April 1945 as compared with a like movement of 4.0 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 25,000 lb. in transit on May 1.
