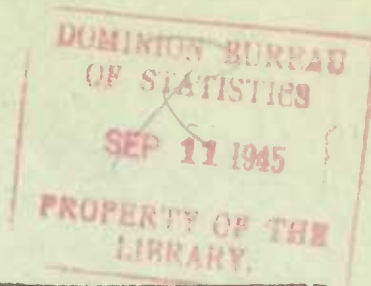

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, SEPT. 1, 1945

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on September 1, 1945 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 67,674,670 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 66,719,870 lb. and 954,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 3,500,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 47,673,199 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 19,046,671 lb. of 28.5 per cent.

The summary total was more than last year by 3.3 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of August was 11.5 million lb. (being 30.2 per cent of the August production figures) as compared with a like movement of 10.0 million lb. for August 1944. The five-year average of stocks was 62,391,000 lb. Of the current total the Dairy Products Board held 3,679,256 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at September 1, 1945 amounted to 62,539 lb. which was a decrease of 55,741 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 308,628 lb. of this product on hand.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 64,680,987 lb. consisting of 64,054,145 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 2,267,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 18,842 lb. imported and 608,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was an increase of 2.7 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of September 1, 1944. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for August was 2.2 million lb. (being 3.3 per cent of the August 1 stock figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 591 thousand lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 46,899,009 lb. which was an increase of 11.5 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for August was 2.0 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 6,254,669 lb., an increase of 2.6 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 911 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 16,167,390 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,032,950 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 19,200,340 dozens on September 1, as compared with 15,095,792 dozens on September 1, 1944. Shell Eggs in transit at September 1, 1945 amounted to 540,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 28,804,774 lb. being 35.9 per cent less than the 1944 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for August 1945 was 1.1 million lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 2.2 million lb. during August 1944. The Special Products Board held 17,571,808 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On September 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 5,524,865 lb., being a decrease of 4.5 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,242,094 lb., fowl to 1,953,840 lb. and turkeys to 700,152 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 291 thousand lb. is shown for August 1945 as compared with an opposite movement of 66 thousand lb. for the same month last year.
