STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JANUARY 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 36,246,261 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 35,711,461 lb. and 534,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,334,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 24,912,208 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 10,799,253 lb. or 30.2 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 4.7 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December was 15.2 million lb. (being 29.8 per cent of the December 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 11.6 million lb. for December 1944. The five-year average of stocks was 37,677,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1946 amounted to 63,952 lb. which was a decrease of 65,086 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 209,912 lb. of this product on hand as compared with 144,157 lb. on the same date last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 33,672,417 lb. consisting of 26,440,169 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 876,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 12,248 lb. imported and 7,220,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 12.8 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of January 1, 1945. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for December was 16.7 million lb. (being 38.7 per cent of the December 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.0 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 18,422,534 lb. which was a decrease of 14.7 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for December was 5.8 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 1,806,949 lb., a decrease of 1.5 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 988 thousand lb. from last month or 35.4 per cent.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 70,680 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,014,956 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 2,085,636 dozens on January 1, as compared with 2,822,371 dozens on January 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at January 1, 1946 amounted to 1,350,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 8,666,481 lb. being 71.3 per cent less than the 1945 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1945 was 5.6 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 7.7 million lb. during December 1944. The Special Products Board held 2,458,640 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On January 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 15,990,183 lb., being a decrease of 8.4 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,815,080 lb., fowl to 6,854,046 lb. and turkeys to 1,132,580 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 582 thousand lb. is shown for December 1945 as compared with a like movement of 5.7 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 50,000 lb. dressed poultry in carloads on January 1, 1946.
